Region III of the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Performance Track Members held their regional meeting at The Sustainability Park<sup>™</sup> in Chester, Virginia on January 31, 2007. The meeting brought together state, federal, and private sector representatives from Delaware, West Virginia, Virginia, and Pennsylvania for discussion on advancing the principles of sustainability and environmental management systems.

The Performance Track meeting allowed open and frank discussion on permit flexibility to improve the environment, sharing ideas through case studies, as well as determining how LEAN principles might be applied to organizations desiring to achieve environmental excellence.

Harry Gregori, Vice President of Environmental Solutions, Inc., master tenant of The Park, stated, "It was a great opportunity to be able to host the meeting at The Sustainability Park<sup>™</sup> and illustrate the type of facility that can advance the goals of the Performance Track group. Additionally, The Park allows for by-products research, pilot testing, and implementation that address by-product management and the principles of sustainability."

Since the program's inception in June 2000, Performance Track members report that they have collectively reduced their water use by nearly 1.9 billion gallons, conserved close to 9,000 acres of land, and have increased their use of recycled materials by nearly 120,000 tons.
